The Chief health information officer (CHIO) oversees clinical information system implementations and also is responsible for developing the organization's overall strategy for using IT to improve care.

The Chief Medical Information Officer (CMIO) is a key senior leader in health information technology focusing on medicine and technology, sometimes assuming the role of CIO or CMO. Many CMIOs oversee population health IT initiatives. Some CMIOs are responsible for managing the functions that provide analytics to measure care quality. With hospitals consolidating, regulations increasing and patient-care processes becoming more complex and demanding, the role of the CMIO is expanding in reach, influence and importance.

The Chief Nurse Information Officer (CNIO) emerged over the last decade with the realization that leadership is required to bridge the gap between patient care and technology for the largest sector of healthcare workers – an estimated 3 million US nurses.

The Chief Clinical Informatics Officer (CCIO) remains heterogeneous with individuals deriving from a variety of clinical settings and backgrounds. The CCIO was added to the healthcare leadership teams to compliment the CIO, similar to the CMIO and CNIO.

Chief Integration Officer. The chief integration officer, which may also be known as the vice president of population health or chief accountable care officer, is responsible for organizational design in population health initiatives. As hospitals and health systems seek to align with other healthcare organizations and acquire physician practices, the chief integration officer oversees the alignments and facilitates ACO creation. This person may also have responsibilities negotiating payer contracts and developing clinical strategies.
